Secrecy Envelope/Sleeve with Voter Instructions

How do I vote my ballot?

Follow all the voting instructions shown on your ballot. After you have marked all your voting choices and finished voting:

- 1. Refold your ballot along the original fold lines.
- 2. DO NOT REMOVE THE BALLOT STUB.
- 3. Place your voted ballot in this Secrecy Envelope/Sleeve.
- 4. Place the Secrecy Envelope/Sleeve (with voted ballot) into the official Return Envelope.
- 5. Sign and date the "Self-Affirmation" located on the back of the official Return Envelope. See example below.

Only one voter's ballot is permitted in your official Return Envelope. If more than one ballot is placed in the official Return Envelope, none of the ballots will be counted.

By law, your signature is required on the self-affirmation (located on the back of the official Return Envelope). If you do not sign this affidavit, your ballot will not be counted I state under penalty of perjury that I am an elector who is eligible to vote each of the ballots that I have cast in this election; that my signature and name are as shown on this envelope; that I have not and will not cast more than one ballot for a matter to be decided in this election; and that my ballots are cast in accordance with applicable law.
